6. MINOR AMENDMENT TO PART 2 OF THE COUNCIL CONSTITUTION – ARTICLE 14 – POINT 14:03 (CED)

1 Summary

- 1.1 This report is being brought to Council to agree a minor amendment to Part 2 of the Council Constitution, Article 14, Point 14:03.
- 1.2 Article 14, Point 14:03 currently states the following:

14.03 Legal Proceedings

The Solicitor to the Council is authorised to institute, defend or participate in any legal proceedings in any case where such action is necessary to give effect to decisions of the Council or in any case where the Solicitor to the Council considers that such action is necessary to protect the Council's interests.

1.3 Council are asked to agree to add the following wording:

The Solicitor to the Council (or, with the Solicitor to the Council's prior written authorisation, a Principal Lawyer), is authorised to institute, defend or participate in any legal proceedings in any case where such action is necessary to give effect to decisions of the Council or in any case where the Solicitor to the Council considers that such action is necessary to protect the Council's interests.

2.1 The reason for the report coming to Council is to provide more resilience.
