The Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) (England) Order 2015

Article 4(1) Directions without immediate effect relating to office to residential change of use at Croxley Green Business Park, Watford; Tolpits Lane Employment Area; and Maple Cross/Maple Lodge Employment Area

I refer to your email of 5 August notifying the Secretary of State about the article 4 Directions made on 5 August 2016 in respect of Croxley Green Business Park, Watford; Tolpits Lane Employment Area; and Maple Cross/Maple Lodge Employment Area. If confirmed, the Directions would withdraw permitted development rights for buildings and any land within its curtilage which fall within Class B1(a) use of the Schedule of the Town and Country Planning (Use Classes) (Amendment) (England) Order 2015, to convert to Class C3 use of that Schedule being development comprised within Class O of Part 3 of Schedule 2 to the said Order and not being development comprised with any other Class.

The Government has run a national exemption scheme for this permitted development right. The outcome was the designation of land areas at article 1(6)(A) of the 1995 Order which are exempt from the permitted development right granted by Class J of Part 3 in Schedule 2 to the 1995 Order.

The Secretary of State is considering whether there is cause for him to use his powers of intervention under article Schedule J, Paragraph 1(13) of the 2015 Order. The Secretary of State will consider whether the Directions fulfil national policy set out in Paragraph 200 of the National Planning Policy Framework¹ on the use of article 4 directions, and whether it is in accordance with guidance on the use of article 4 directions as set out in National Planning Practice Guidance².
