ALL YEAR ROUND
Among our resident birds we have some real gems. A piping call, a flash of blue and you've just caught a glimpse of a Kingfisher. Always elegant, Great Crested Grebes put on a real show in late winter, when they start their courtship displays.

In summer, Common Terns can be seen fishing over the lakes. Swallows and Martins skim for insects over the water and Swifts scream high overhead on their aerial chases.

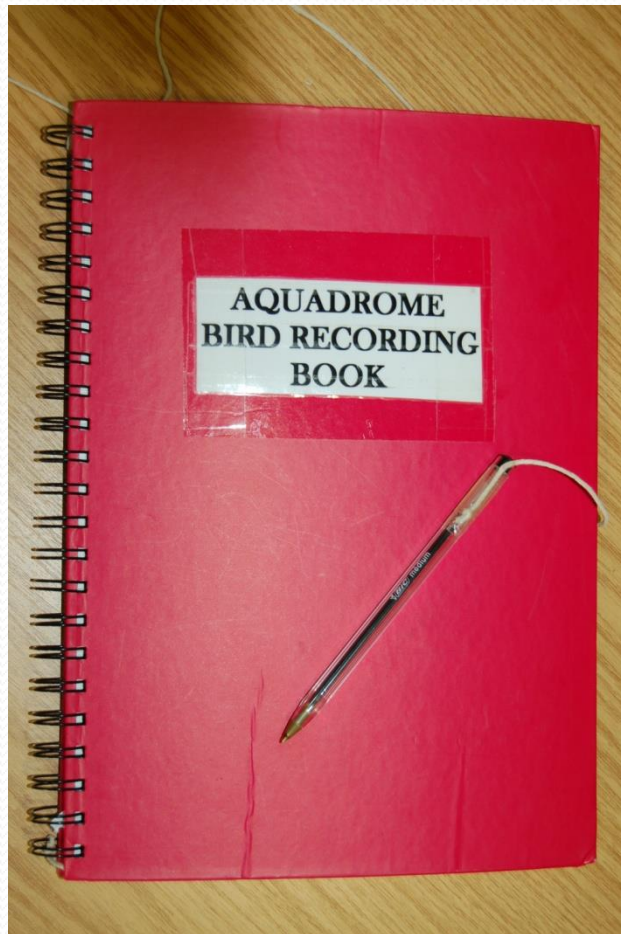

In the winter months, we have an influx of wildfowl from colder climes. Bury Lake is spring fed, and when surrounding water bodies are mostly frozen, Bury Lake often stays open and as a result large numbers of waterfowl congregate on it.
