3 GAMBLING ACT 2005 - REVIEW OF STATEMENT OF LICENSING POLICY (DCES)

1 Summary

- 1.1 This report seeks Members' consideration of the draft Statement of Gambling Principles and Policy for the period 2018–2021 (hereafter referred to as "the draft Statement of Policy"). The draft Statement of Policy must be published no later than 3 January 2019 to come in to force by 31 January 2019. This will replace the current Statement of Policy (2016 – 2019) which was agreed in December 2015.

2 Details

- 2.1 The Gambling Act 2005 ("the Act") which fully came into force on 1 September 2007 introduced a new regime for commercial gambling to be conducted by the Gambling Commission and by Licensing Authorities depending on the matter to be licensed.

- 2.2 In exercising its functions under the Act, the Council must have regard to the licensing objectives which are set out in Section 1 of the Act, namely:

- Preventing gambling from being a source of crime or disorder, being associated with crime or disorder or being used to support crime;
- Ensuring that gambling is conducted in a fair and open way, and
- Protecting children and other vulnerable persons from being harmed or exploited by gambling.

- 2.3 Under the Act it states that a licensing authority shall before each period of three years prepare and publish a statement of principles (the draft Statement of Policy). The Statement of Policy forms the licensing authority's mandate for managing local gambling provision and sets out how the licensing authority views the local risk environment.

- 2.4 The Council has previously passed a 'No Casinos' resolution under Section 166(5) of the Act. This was passed by Full Council on 17 October 2006 and the resolution is attached to the draft Statement of Policy at Appendix 4.

- 2.5 The Gambling Commission guidance states that Statements of Policy should be published no later than 3 January 2019.

3 Options and Reasons for Recommendations

- 3.1 In preparing the Statement of Policy or any revision of it, the Council must undertake a consultation process and publish the statement and any revision of it, before it can take effect.

- 3.2 Consultation, which is a fundamental part of the review process will commence following Members' agreement to the draft Statement of Policy. The list of Consultees is set out at Appendix 1 of the draft Statement of

Policy (which is attached at Appendix V of this report). The draft consultation letter is attached at Appendix I of this report.

3.3 The purpose of this proposed draft Statement of Policy is to include new legislation, to make the policy more robust, enforceable and to ensure it is in force by 31 January 2019. Members should be made aware that in the absence of a Statement of Policy the Council would not be able to exercise its function under the Act.

3.4 The changes to the current Statement of Policy are shown by the track changes at Appendix IV. A clean version is also provided at Appendix V. The main changes include:

- Introduction of local risk assessments
- Inclusion of information about multiple premises licences
- New information concerning reviews and appeals
- Changes to wording to make policy more robust
- Inclusion of the “No Casinos” resolution

3.5 Following any consultation process the response of the consultation and any amendments to the Statement of Policy will be referred back to this Committee.

3.6 Members are asked to consider two recommendations/options:

Option 1 – Members of the Committee note the report and agree the draft Statement of Policy to be sent out for Consultation.

Option 2 – Members of the Committee agree that the Council confirms the continuation of a ‘No Casinos’ Policy within the draft Statement of Policy.

4 Financial Implications

4.1 There will be no financial implications.

5 Legal Implications

5.1 The Act must be adhered to in this process.

5.2 If the Statement of Policy is not brought in to force in the time scales outlined above, the Council will not have a policy to work to under the Act. A Statement of Policy sets out the principles of the Council and its expectations in respect of applications and representations made in respect of those applications. The Statement gives general information on how the licensing process will be carried out and indicates the expectations of the Council in assisting it to make its judgements on individual applications, and in carrying out its enforcement role. The Statement is vital in the Council’s exercise of its powers under the Act.

9.5 The above risks are plotted on the matrix below depending on the scored assessments of impact and likelihood, detailed definitions of which are included in the risk management strategy. The Council has determined its aversion to risk and is prepared to tolerate risks where the combination of impact and likelihood are plotted in the shaded area of the matrix. The remaining risks require a treatment plan.
