Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

5. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on

request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

6. The responsible person must ensure that—

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

7. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

8. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7 —

- (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula —

$$P=D+(D \times V)$$

where —

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence —
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

9. Where the permitted price given by paragraph (b) of paragraph 8 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

10. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by paragraph (b) of paragraph 8 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
11. The admission of children, that is persons aged under 18, to the exhibition of any film shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the film classification body designated by section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984.
12. If at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e)

Following an assessment of the premises and its surrounding area the following are proposed:-

- 30 minute “drinking up time” to allow appropriate dispersal, use of lavatories etc.
- In order to further the licensing objectives the licensee reserves the right to move the fire appliances, AWP machines, cigarette machines and or other objects temporarily in a fixed location, which may impact on the ability of individuals on the premises to use exits or escape routes without impediment.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- The external illumination covering the customer car park and beer garden will be kept in place and in good working order.
- The CCTV monitoring the garden area will be kept in place and in good working order.
- The current rota system for staff checking the customer toilets will be kept.
- The Licensee and staff will regularly monitor customer behaviour, especially during busy periods.
- A burglar alarm system, to protect the property will be in place.
- The use or possession of drugs on the premises will not be tolerated under any circumstances.

c) Public Safety

- The Health & Safety risk assessment in place for the premises, will be checked on a daily/weekly/quarterly basis, depending on the level of risk.
- New staff will receive induction training on Health & Safety, COSHH is also in place.
- The premises is equipped with emergency lighting, illuminated fire exits and a fire detection system throughout, these are to be in place at all times.
- All fire equipment is to be serviced annually.
- All portable electrical appliances are to be tested annually and valid electrical and gas certificates to be in place.
- Mechanical smoke extraction will be provided in the bar area.
- All kitchen based food handlers must hold the basic Food Hygiene certificates.

- Staff shall be trained in the disability policy for the premises, and offer assistance when it's requested.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

- The licensee will take appropriate measures to ensure that noise and activities normally associated with a public house, are kept to an acceptable level.
- Customers will be encouraged to disperse quietly at closing time.
- All windows and doors will be kept closed after 23:00 hours, except for access and egress.
- Background recorded music only, will be played after 23:00 hours.

e) The protection of children from harm

- Unaccompanied children are not permitted on the premises.
- No children permitted after 22:00 hours
- The AWP and cigarette machine will continue to be placed in close proximity to the bar counter, so as to be in good view of the bar staff.
- Approved proof of age ID required, whenever there is doubt.

1 The sale of alcohol:

2. The playing of recorded music:

3. An additional 10 minutes drinking up time, to allow 30 minutes in total after the last permitted sale of alcohol.

4. The opening time on Sunday mornings of 10.00 – 12.00 hours shall be for the supply of food only.

5. Non Standard hours applied for are not granted.

With the following conditions:

1. The external drinking area will be closed to customers at 22.30 hours every day.
2. No admission to any person under the age of 21 years (excluding children accompanied by a person over the age 21 years up to 22.00 hours)
3. All staff to be trained in drug awareness.
4. Prominent and clear and legible notices will be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents, and to leave the premises quietly.
5. The mandatory conditions.
6. The provisions of the Operating Schedule shall apply.

Reasons for the decisions.

The prevention of Public Nuisance
The prevention of Crime and Disorder

The decision relates in particular to the two licensing objectives and takes fully into account that this is a residential area.
