## **Mandatory requirements**

For a project to be scored against the scoring criteria all mandatory requirements must be met:

- 1. The application form must be completed correctly
- 2. The organisation must be capable of carrying out the project and if land owner consent is required evidence of approval must be produced as part of the bid application
- 3. The project must meet the requirements of the Community Infrastructure Levy Regulations 2010 (as amended):
  - The project must be clearly defined as infrastructure as per the Planning Act 2008
  - Funding must be for "the provision, improvement, replacement, operation or maintenance of infrastructure to support the development of its area
- CIL is intended for the provision of new infrastructure and should not be used to remedy pre-existing deficiencies in infrastructure provision, unless those deficiencies will be made more severe by new development. The levy can be used to increase the capacity of existing infrastructure or to repair failing existing infrastructure, if that is necessary to support development.
