

Appendix A

To Prevent Crime and Disorder:

The Coach and Horses is in a residential area; therefore, we have to be considerate of each other as neighbours. Although our street is always fully occupied by the pub's customers' vehicles and there is a noise (especially from the parking lot at closing time and the playground) the situation is just about bearable with the current volume of customers. However, we have concerns that the odd incidents of crime and inconveniences that do occur would increase as the volume of customers increases and this would not be acceptable. There have been some incidents of cars being damaged and the police have attributed this to vandalism (likely from pub customers). There has also been an incident of domestic abuse between customers that spilled out of the pub into our road in which I had to call the police.

To Prevent Public Nuisance:

Currently there is a considerable amount of moise coming from the beer garden and the children's playground. The noise from the Children's Playground, in particular, starts early in the day most days - about 13:00 (even in Autumn and Spring). Our garden adjoins the pub and we have found that the area has gotten busier over the last three years and, as the playground is quite well designed for fun, the screaming and yells from the playground means that most days and evenings our garden is a very noisy place to be. The higher-up play equipment exacerbates this as the sound easily carries across our shared fence. We also find rubbish that has been lobbed over the fence into our garden on a regular basis. If these hours are extended and if more people and children are out in the garden later, then this problem will be worse – particularly later in the evening as children become more tired and louder and the dim light makes it harder for parents to watch their children (which already not happening satisfactorily).

To Protect Children from Harm:

The supervision of children in the playground is currently an issue and extending these playground hours will extend the problem for more hours and make the problem worse as children get tired and the light gets dim. We have already had instances of children elimbing over the pub side of the fence and dropping into our backgarden and getting stuck in our bushes. The fence is 6ft tall and aside from being a nuisance, it is not safe to have children dropping that far. Additionally, we have recently had a situation in which children climbed from the play equipment to some trees in the playground and then dropped onto the roof of our outbuilding. This is clearly unsafe. No responsible adult in either of these cases seem to observe the missing children or take responsibility for the dangerous actions.




REPRESENTATION INFORMATION RE: THE COACH & HORSES PUB, THE GREEN, CROXLEY GREEN

I object to both amendments to the current license, under the objectives to Prevent crime and disorder, public nuisance, public safety and to protect children from harm.

- 1) To locate an external bar in the garden the applicant has put the reason as "simply means that the customers will have less far to carry their drinks." And "It is considered that there should be no impact on the potential for noise nuisance." I would like to address these two issues.
 - a) A bar in the garden with less distance to walk, could allow customers to consume more alcohol in a shorter space of time. Therefore, leading to an increase in crime and disorder affecting public safety and increased public nuisance.
 - b) There will surely be more noise from kegs, glasses etc leading to a public nuisance.
 - c) The external bar will encourage customers to remain in the beer garden for a much longer time thus increasing noise nuisance. I am very concerned the impact this will have on the quiet enjoyment of my garden.
 - d) I consider this bar will also cause a problem with the supervisor's ability to manage the licensing hours. As stated in the application the garden area is already "difficult to manage", this could lead to a public nuisance.
- 2) The amendment to increase the hours the children can be in the play area of the garden, to 10:30 – 21:00 daily. I strongly object to this as my late husband and I, and other residents worked hard to have the current licensing hours put in place. The garden space is attached to two residential homes.
 - a) As stated in the application the pub supervisor finds the current licensing hours "especially difficult to manage". Therefore, it would be more prudent to amend the garden hours for children, to run alongside the existing licensing hours. There is no justification to increase them.
 - b) There is already a significant negative impact on the quiet enjoyment of my garden with the current licensing hours not being managed. If the hours are increased daily, it will be detrimental and will lead to a public nuisance.
 - c) I am concerned about the protection of children from harm due to the statement in the application "it is believed the licensing objectives will be promoted by ensuring children are accompanied by a responsible adult." Does this mean that the children are currently not being accompanied by a responsible adult?

I can provide more information pertaining to the above should the Licensing Committee require it.







Public Safety

Having the garden open with the extended bar until 11pm will increase the likelihood of waste (cigarettes, glassware, litter) being thrown onto the drive leading to our houses. My children regularly have to avoid cans, bottles and general rubbish that has been discarded in the lane leading from the pub to our house, when walking to and from school each day.

Also, as it is allegedly too far for customers to carry their drinks from the pub, it may be too far for the male customers to carry their bladders back to the inside toilets, thereby increasing the likelihood of urinating in the garden and driveway, which has been witnessed by passers-by. It often smells of urine along the private road (gravel path) leading from the pub to our home.

Public Nuisance

If the licensing hours are extended and an outside bar is open and functioning, then having larger groups of people in the garden until 11pm will inevitably cause a noise disturbance for local residents. After all, the reason for increasing the hours, I assume, is to increase clientele numbers and raise income.

At present, if patrons are wanting additional drinks they have to walk back to the pub which may encourage patrons to stop drinking sooner - an extension to the hours and having an outside bar in situ would likely prolong the time the loud noise is heard and the noise levels would likely increase as the alcohol consumption rises.

As is noted, the landlord cannot manage to stop children going on the play equipment, so this problem will only get worse as (young) children will inevitably remain in the garden on the play equipment after 9pm.

Protection of Children

Encouraging and allowing children to be in a pub garden, using play equipment suitable for very young-aged children, until 9pm on weekdays should not be allowed.

As a parent and someone who works with children, getting a good night's sleep is very important and necessary in order to get a good education. An extension to the licensing hours, having access to a manned outside bar and increasing access to the play area, goes against this and shows a lack of community wellbeing and an absence of a duty of care to the local people of Croxley Green.

The landlord needs to take social responsibility, rather than thinking only about their own financial gain. The play equipment should retain its closing hours of 8pm during the week, and 6pm on a Sunday.

This application should be rejected.
